## Patriots Day September 11, 2024

On September 11, Patriot Day gives all of us time to reflect on the devastating terror attacks that took nearly 3,000 lives. We commemorate those who we lost and give thanks to the brave first responders who put their lives on the line. Take a moment today to consider what we stand for as a nation and how we can work together to make the world a better place for all.

The majority of lives that were people that worked in the Twin Towers, especially the floors above the collision point as people were trapped and stranded at the top of the burning skyscraper. 411 men and women working in emergency services lost their lives trying to fight fires and rescue people from the build-


ings. It was a heartbreaking attack, which is why Patriot Day was proclaimed by President George W. Bush and is recognized every year on September 11.

On Patriot Day, U.S. flags are lowered halfway, and there is a country-wide moment of silence at 8:46 am (Eastern Daylight Time), which is when the first plane crashed into one of the Twin Towers. Although the attacks were in the U.S., Patriot Day is recognized worldwide as the news devastated and impacted people all over.

### **Cancer Grants**

**The** VFW Auxiliary offers cancer grants to members who are battling cancer. Eligibility requirements:

- Applicant must be a member of the VFW Auxiliary for one (1) full year.
- Current dues must be paid before applying for a cancer



grant.

- After twelve (12) months have passed from date of diagnosis or last treatment, application will not be accepted.
- A member is allowed two (2)

grants during lifetime. Twelve (12) months must elapse between new diagnosis and/or treatment from date of first grant for a second application to be considered. Continuous treatment which lasts beyond the twelve (12) month period will qualify for a second grant.

 Application will be rejected if member has been deceased for longer than 30 days.

The grant amount is currently \$550.00, and funds are paid directly to the member or, in the case of a deceased member, to their estate.

Funds are dispersed 2-4 weeks following the acceptance and approval of the completed and signed application. Please read the instructions carefully before applying. The most common reason an application is denied is due to missing information from either the member or physician.

To access the application, log into your MALTA account.

### **Eagle Scout Honors Veterans**

On a hot summer August day, Cooper Rey setout to do a very ambitious Eagle Scout Project. Cooper is a Life Scout from Troop 346 out of St. Michaels Church.

Cooper is working on his Eagle Scout Project honoring Veterans. The project is to create a database with photos of Veterans headstones at the four major cemeteries in Sioux Falls. These cemeteries are Hills of Rest, Me. Pleasant, Woodlawn and St. Michaels.

To make this project a reality, Cooper reached out to other Scout Troops, Veteran Service Organizations and the local community for assistance. Reaching out brought in approximately 75 volunteers for this portion on the project. Cooper and his family estimate there are around nine thousand veteran headstones to document within the major Sioux Falls cemeteries.

"It's also big in our history of South Dakotans because there's a lot of Civil War vets and World War I, World War II vets," Rey said. "So, it tells a lot about our history."

The project is in two phases. Phase one was completed August 24, 2024. This phase consisted of the volunteers uploading of an App that would include a picture of the veteran's headstone and a GPS location. Phase one was kicked off at 8 am, beginning at Hills of Rest Cemetery and concluded at approximately 6pm. Many of the volunteers dedicated the whole day to assisting in this project.



The second phase will be soon with the input of the data into the database. The dates for phase two are to be determined. Volunteers will once again be needed with putting the information into the data base. Information that will be inserted into the database will include Name of the veterans, date of birth and death, GPS coordinates, and the service of the veteran. This phase will be the longest and will require more volunteers. That information will be given later to be announced.

Thanks to Cooper Rey, his parents and all the volunteers that have spent their time on such a honorable project. Information will be updated as we get the information.

### **POW/MIA Recognition Day**

Many Americans across the United States pause to remember the sacrifices and service of those who were prisoners of war (POW), as well as those who are missing in action (MIA), and their families. All military installations fly the National League of Families' POW/MIA flag, which symbolizes the nation's remembrance of those who were imprisoned while serving in conflicts and those who remain missing.



Veteran rallies take place in many states, such as Wisconsin, in the United States on National POW/MIA Recognition Day. United States flags and POW/MIA flags are flown on this day and joint prayers are made for POWs and those missing in action. National POW/MIA Recognition Day posters are also displayed at college or university campuses and public buildings to promote the day. Re-

membrance ceremonies and other events to observe the day are also held in places such as the Pentagon, war memorials and museums.

There are 1,741 American personnel listed by the Defense Department's POW/MIA Office as missing and unaccounted for from the Vietnam War, as of April 2009. The number of United States personnel accounted for since the end of the Vietnam War in 1975 is 841. About 90 percent of the 1,741 people still missing were lost in Vietnam or areas of Laos and Cambodia under Vietnam's wartime control,



according to the National League of Families website.

The United States Congress passed a resolution authorizing National POW/ MIA Recognition Day is to be observed the third Friday of September. The United States

president each year proclaims National POW/MIA Recognition Day. Many states in the USA also proclaim POW/MIA Recognition Day together with the national effort.

POW/MIA Day will be observed in Sioux Falls on September 20 at Veterans Memorial park at 6PM.
