TBI Among Women Veterans

Women Veterans are the fastest growing group of VA users. The VHA TBI screen focuses on deploymentrelated TBIs—but women are more likely than men to have TBI related to non deployment experiences such as intimate partner violence. Investigators at VA Boston evaluated TBI screening among women Veterans. In this sample of 90 women Veterans, a chart review revealed that, despite VHA's universal screening mandate, 14.4% of the sample had not been screened for TBI. The investigators administered the VHA TBI screen followed by a gold-standard interview that assessed both deployment- and non-deployment-related TBIs. According to the interview, 58.9% of women Veterans had experienced a lifetime TBI, only 45.3% of which were detected by the screen. The 27 nondeployment TBIs not captured by the screen were most commonly related to physical assault (n = 14, 10from intimate partners) or sports (n = 13). The screen was largely effective for identifying deployment-related TBIs. Results suggest that the VHA TBI screen likely underestimates the prevalence of TBI among women Veterans because it omits non-deployment experiences. Expanding TBI screening beyond deploymentrelated TBIs would increase opportunities for referring women Veterans to needed care.



Military ID Cardholders Renew Online

Defense officials have announced good news for approximately 1 million people who have a

- The USID card being renewed must be active, not expired. Children are eligible for online USID renewal if they have an active USID card.
- The
- The sponsor and the cardholder must have email addresses listed in the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS). You can check your data in DEERS to make sure it's up to date.
- The cardholder must have a photo saved in DEERS that was taken within the last 12 years.
- •
- The cardholder must have a current U.S. address in DEERS. Cards can't be mailed to P.O. boxes.

Finally, once the new ID card is received and activated, the old card will be deactivated and will need to be returned to the government. You can also take the deactivated card to the nearest Real-Time Automated Personnel Identification System (RAPIDS) site, or mail them to: DMDC-DSC, Attn: USID Card Returns, 2102 E. 21st Street N, Wichita, KS 67214.

Vietnam War Memorial Dedicated

November 13, 1982

Near the end of a weeklong national salute to Americans who served in the Vietnam War, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial is dedicated in Washington, D.C. after a march to its site by thousands of veterans of the conflict. The long-awaited memorial was a simple V-shaped black-granite wall inscribed with the names of the 57,939 Americans who died in the conflict, arranged in order of death, not rank, as was common in other memorials.



The Vietnam Veterans Memorial soon became one of the most visited memorials in the nation's capital. "The Wall" drew together both those who fought and those who

marched against the war and served to promote national healing a decade after the divisive conflict's end.

Military Environmental Exposure Evaluations Program

Veterans Exposure Team-Health Outcomes Military Exposures (VET-HOME) is a new VA program that uses telehealth to perform military environmental health registry evaluations. VET-HOME VA clinicians will create a detailed exposure history, record symptoms or abnormalities potentially related to the military environmental exposures, conduct a physical examination (or review the results of a previous examination), and inform veterans of their eligibility for one of VA's six environmental health registries. In Case You Missed It

The House and Senate Committees on Armed Services are negotiating their versions of the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for Fiscal Year 2025. An important VFW legislative priority, S.2888 / H.R.3933, *TAP Promotion Act*, is currently in the House version (Section 563) only. Ensuring veterans receive their VA benefits and

health care as soon as they leave the military facilitates a smooth transition, and can also reduce the risk of homelessness, food insecurity, and suicide. <u>Tell Congress</u> to keep the *TAP Promotion Act* in the final version of the defense bill to make permanent VA's practice of including accredited claims representatives in TAP classes.
