

Recent visit from Congressional Medal of Honor recipient, Clint Romesha. Sergeant Romesha spoke of his time in one of the most dangerous locations in Afghanistan.


Former Staff Sgt. Clinton L. Romesha (pronounced Row-ma-shay) was born in Lake City, California. Romesha enlisted in the Army in September 1999, as an M1 armor crewman. After completion of training at Fort Knox, Kentucky, he was assigned as a tank gunner with B Company, 1-63rd Armor, in Vilseck, Germany. He was also included an operational deployment to Kosovo.

After Germany, he was assigned as a gunner/assistant tank commander with A Company, 2-72nd Armor, Camp Casey, Korea. Following Korea, deployed to Iraq, he was assigned as a section leader with 3-61st Cavalry, Fort Carson, Colo. There he completed the Long Range Reconnaissance Course, Advanced Leader Course and Air Assault Training.

Romesha deployed twice to Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom, and once to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. At the time of the deadly attack on Combat Outpost Keating, Kamdesh District, Afghanistan, on Oct. 3, 2009, Staff Sgt. Romesha was assigned as a section leader for Bravo Troop, 3-61st Cavalry, 4th Brigade Combat Team, 4th Infantry Division.

In addition to the Medal of Honor, Romesha's awards and decorations include the Bronze Star Medal, Purple Heart, Army Commendation Medal (with two oak leaf clusters), Army Achievement Medal (with four Oak Leaf Clusters), Army Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Kosovo Campaign Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal (with two bronze service stars), Iraq Campaign Medal (with three bronze service stars), Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Korean Defense Service Medal, Noncommissioned Officer Professional Development Ribbon (with numeral two device), Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon (with numeral five device), NATO Medal (with bronze service star), the Valorous Unit Award, Meritorious Unit Commendation, the Combat Action Badge and the Air Assault Badge.

Established in 1947, our **Voice of Democracy**® audioessay program provides high school students with the unique opportunity to express themselves in regard to a democratic and patriotic-themed recorded essay. Each year, more than 26,400 ninth through 12th grade students from across the country enter to win their share of more than \$1.4 million in educational scholarships and incentives awarded through the program.

The national first place winner receives a \$35,000 scholarship paid directly to the recipient's American university, college or vocational/technical school.

Each year, the Veterans of Foreign Wars selects elementary, middle, and high school teachers to participate in the Smart/Maher VFW National Citizenship Education Teacher program.



Teacher nominations are received at VFW Post 628 where they are reviewed and teacher of the year is selected and recognized for their contributions to our area students.

The 2025-2026 Teacher of the Year is Paige Wright. Paige teaches at Harrisburg South Middle School. She is a graduate of University of South Dakota. Paige was recently a Special

Guest speaker at the event, Ed Rising at USD. Paige was also selected as Teacher of the Year for the Department of South Dakota VFW.

This year's Patriots Pen written essay competition presented our judges with some very creative thoughts. The theme this year is "How Are You Showing Patriotism and Support for Our Country?

Each year, more than 60,600 students in sixth through eighth grades enter the VFW's **Patriot's Pen**® annual youth essay contest for a chance to win their share of nearly \$1 million in state and national awards. The essay contest encourages young minds to examine America's history, along with their own experiences in modern American society, by drafting a 300- to 400-word essay, expressing their views based on a patriotic theme chosen by the VFW Commander-in-Chief.
